It also functions as a resource and research center working on conservation of native breeds of cattle. Awareness is focused more internsively for the Kangayam breed and Korangadu, a unique silvi pastoral land and farming system which is unique kongu region, mid-western Tamil Nadu.

He was a perfect Kangayam bull ,the drought-resistant breed. He had shinning skin, sugarcane coloured horn, short face, double hump, perfect barrel chest, stronglegs, compact shoes, sturdy back and thin tail. Best of all,he was a gentleman at heart. He was gentle towards people who interacted with him and was a loving and gentle partner to the cows he courted.

Bully was an awe factor of our farm. He stood majestic, tall and strong and had an unmatched charisma which made him a star attraction at all cattle shows that he participated. He was admired by people near and far and of all ages. He had the perfect blend of great features, performance of a stud and gentle nature. It is not hard to believe that he was the inspiration for many to rear native breeds.

Bully boy was the success of our selective breeding initiative started years ago. From a young age, Bully was quite active and stood out among the other bulls in the farm. He served as our stud bull from 2001.

Demise of this magnificent bull sent waves of distress among fans and cattle lovers across the globe. SKCRF received numerous calls conveying condolences and many people even visited the farm. Being the most photographed bull, socialmedia had numerous posts conveying condolences with various Hashtags including #RIPBullyBoy. Newspapers and magazines had articles on him and there was extensive coverage in Television channels. All this gest are reassured our belief and assured us on the support extended towards native breeds.

As a tribute to our BullyBoy, we are working towards building a museum dedicated to him as a part of our upcoming Visitor Information Centre.We would be completing this construction by 2020! We are looking forward to your contribution and support in making this happen. BullyBoy,lot of Senaapathy Kangayam Cattle Research Foundation ,was undoubtedly the most-photographed bull and a true symbol of native breed.

Like wise the earthen ware used in yester year cooking is also part of the traditional collection in SKCRF. Awareness is also created in how our ancestors did not pollute environment or cause damage to the system.
