




From the Chairman's desk

Dear friends of SKCRF, native livestock enthusiasts, well wishers, members of Kangayam Cattle Breeders Society and policy makers, this year has been a landmark achievement for us as the Jallikattu ban has been revoked by the Government of Tamilnadu in January 2017. The awareness created by SKCRF and the efforts put in by various native livestock keepers and lovers, with the whopping support from the young student crowd across the state and worldwide, a historical moment. The law was enacted permitting the native livestock sports to be conducted for not only Jallikattu but for other events, in other States in India. They simply followed the Tamilnadu model in reviving their native sport like Kambala, Bailgada etc. This was a moment that we all should take pride in our achievement and strive towards further safe guarding our ancient tradition with current relevance especially with our livestock.

Karthikeya Sivasenapathy, the Managing Trustee visited various educational institutions in the country and gave lectures on organic farming, rearing cattle and creating awareness about the native cattle breeds emphasizing on bio-diversity, afforestation and rain water harvesting. He also played a predominant role in creating awareness on the importance of Jallikattu and to motivate the younger generation.

This year also we saw the worst drought like the previous year, due to insufficient rain fall. This lead to a substantial number of coconut trees drying up in our area, and SKCRF had to go to the extent of purchasing water for our livestock as the water table went low on our requirements. Due to poor rainfall the State saw the worst farmers' suicide. An organization named "Save Tamilnadu Farmer" from the USA supported the families of the farmers who committed suicide. SKCRF collaborated with the organization and educated the farmers family in Drought Management, Natural Farming and Organic Farming. SKCRF also supported in sourcing Native cattle for the families to aid in their sustainability. Workshops were conducted over many weekends,



However, we were also happy to have had good rains in the later part of this year which came as a blessing for our farm and the livestock. SKCRF undertook a major rain water harvesting project and nos offers consultancy services and now training to others. I invite fellow farmers and land holders to have rain water harvesting done with 30 percentage of your land holding to help yourself which will help in the time of crises.

This year too we had various individual visitors visiting SKCRF, after an increase in the awareness of native milk, which is fetching premium prices in the Urban areas. Students of various Schools and Colleges visited our Farm and had a practical experience of Organic Farming, Cattle Rearing and Rain Water Harvesting methods.

I would like to thank the Honorable Prime Minister of India, Mr. Narendra Modi, Honorable Home Minister of India, Mr. Rajnath Singh, Honorable Union Minister from Tamil Nadu, Mr. Pon Radhakrishnan, Honorable Chief Minister, Mr. O. Paneerselvam and his Cabinet colleagues, Bureaucrats of the Government of Tamilnadu and Government of India, Leader of the Opposition Mr. M. K. Stalin, Mr. Radhakrishnan, Member of Parliament, Pondicherry, (the lone MP who offered to resign for protesting against the ban of Jallikattu), Mrs. Tamilisai Soundara Rajan, Prof. Kanakasababathy, and many unnamed serving officers in the top echelon of Government of Tamilnadu and India, for having contributed in revoking the Jallikattu ban.

In July 2016, Hip Hop Tamizha Alias Aadhi Venkatapathy directed, produced and acted in a musical documentary that created huge awareness and the much needed impetus for the Jallikattu movement.

I would be failing in my duty if I do not thank from the bottom of my heart the Tamil Diaspora world over braving subzero temperature and protesting to protect Tamil culture, identity and voicing their support for farmers. The protest of Tamil Diaspora was one among the major reasons for the change of heart by the Government of India. Am sure the people of Tamilnadu, especially the farming community will never forget the support of the Tamil people living world over.

I would like to thank the media for the support it gave to the foundation throughout the year and the valuable contribution they did in covering up the Jallikattu protest that happened in January not only in the State but all over the world wherever Tamil people lived. Their support made the issue reach out to the larger audience.

I would like to present "Sponsor a Cow!!", and "Donation" initiative once again in a new upgraded format to interested Native Cattle lovers who inquire about their interest in contributing towards supporting the foundation. 2016-2017

This year was loaded with several activities such as visits by various people to SKCRF, a large number of schools who came with students and staff to understand how a farm works, college students who came to associate better with a farm, engagement with Government, taking part in exhibitions, international visits, field visits and providing service and support to livestock keepers. After the Jallikattu protest, visit to SKCRF has almost become a pilgrimage to the youth, native livestock enthusiast, policy makers, Member of Legislative Assembly and Parliament, Government officials etc. This can be seen in the following report.

SKCRF Activities Kannapuram Cattle Shandy

The Kannapuram Cattle Shandy held along with the Annual Car Festival (Theer) of the 11th -century Vikramacholeesvara Temple and the 3rd century Arulmigu Mariamman Temple at Kannapuram, is an important event for farmers, livestock keepers and breeders. It's a week-long cattle fair that's been held from times immemorial. The fair is held in approximately 200 acres of land where genetically pure Kangayam cattle breed are traded.

Claudius Ptolemy, in second century CE has documented the trade route and the cattle fair of Kannapuram. Buchannan, an English traveller in the eighteenth century has also documented the cattle fair. Others who documented the cattle fair include Captain Littlehood, Major Gun, Dr.Kandhasamy, Prof Paneerselvam and Mr. Pattabiram. SKCRF has been documenting Kannapuram shandy from 2009. SKCRF has also archived all documents related to Kannapuram cattle shandy.

Every year on the eve of "Chitra Powrnami" in the second week of April, Kannapuram cattle shandy is organized where farmers bring in their cattle for sale, and buyers from nearby villages and all over Tamil Nadu come to purchase the Kangayam cattle for their farm use.

This year's Kannapuram cattle shandy began on April 8 and concluded on April 16. More than 15,000 original Kangayam cattle were part of the cattle shandy. This year after the revival of Jallikattu and with the increase in awareness of the nutritional value of native cow milk there was a huge demand of both bulls and cows. The temporary shops that were put up during the fair, cattle related goods that support local villager's economy were sold.





Preparing the Cattle for Shandy.

The Kangayam cattle live in semi-ranch conditions until three years of age. Great skill, practice and patience are required in training them. The animals are roped, nose-strung and strong leading ropes are used in tying them to the pegs which are firmly driven into the ground. In the course of a week the animals get accustomed to being tied up and these trained cattle are ready to go to the Shandy.

A typical sight in a shandy

Shaping the horn, checking the number of teeth to find out the age of the cattle, cleaning the cattle, feed and water fed for the cattle, rows of cattle in an organized way, some bulls going around the circle while tied to the peg, some adult bulls stomping their feet in the soil and using their horns to remove soil, young cattle having "mouth mask" (vai koodai) and standing quite, buyers going around looking around for the best cattle, temporary shade structures put up, a few cattle resting on the ground, few been purchased and loaded in trucks are common site that can be noticed in the shandy.





Kangayam Cattle Show

The annual Kangayam cattle show, the most sought-after event of the Western part of Tamilnadu was held on September 18, 2016, in AET School, Thindal, Erode. In this event more than 600 cattle were registered and participated. Chief Guest of this event was Mr. Adhi, fondly called as Hip-Hop-Tamizha. Mr. Arun IPS, Inspector General of Police and Dr. Sivakumar, Superintendent of Police – Erode district were other Guests of the event.

This event was attended by more than one lakh visitors out of which 60% where youngsters and college students. For the first time other breeds of cattle of Tamilnadu namely Bargur, Umbalachery, Puliakulam, where included in the show making it a Pan Tamilnadu show. The district collector Dr. Prabhakaran, I.A.S visited along with his family and appreciated the activities of SKCRF.





Jallikattu Law and Role of SKCRF- A Time Line Creating Awareness in College, University and Schools

Managing Trustee has been visiting various School, Colleges and Universities in the past few years creating awareness on organic farming, why it is important to go back to traditional methods of farming and also touching upon the importance of cattle in farming and why native breeds need to be conserved and preserved. This awareness picked up momentum and came handy while fighting back for saving the traditional sport of Jallikattu. Ban on Jallikattu was a direct threat for native breeds of cattle in Tamil Nadu, because it destroys the irreplaceable gene pool of our native livestock that was evolved over several thousand years

SKCRF has been working on Jallikattu since 2011.

Trustees of SKCRF stepped in to take up the Jallikattu topic, because it was not properly represented in the Supreme Court of India and in the National media, just because farmers and those representing the Jallikattu case were not able to articulate the importance of protecting and conserving the native breeds of cattle and how and why the Jallikattu ban would threaten the native breeds of cattle.

Chennai Marina Beach Protest on January 14, 2012

The first Jallikattu Protest happened on January 14, 2012, where Managing Trustee Mr. Karthikeya Sivasenapathy, along with Trustees, Mr. Sundar Ganesan and Mr. Komkambedu Himakiran, with few other supporters conducted a protest in Marina Beach near Gandhi Statue against PETA, emphasising the importance of Jallikattu. The banners they carried had "We want Jallikattu"!!

Active FaceBook followers of the Managing Trustee were always supportive of the cause in protecting and in saving the breed through Jallikattu.

Madurai Consultation Meet in 2014

SKCRF conducted several consultation meetings in regions where Jallikattu are held. In 2014, a consultation meet was held in Madurai with all the stake holders involved.

Reason behind Jallikattu Protest

In 2016 State Government promised that Jallikattu will happen, and orders will be passed. But in the last minute, the Government did not permit the Jallikattu event.

The same was repeated in the year 2017. The Union Government representatives from Tamil Nadu and the State Government promised that in 2017 the sport will happen. When that was about to be called off, major protest took shape across the State demanding Jallikattu ban be revoked.

Madurai Alanganallur Protest on January 16, 2017

Mr. P. Rajasekhar, President, Jallikattu Peravai, Madurai, Mr. Hip Hop Thamizha Alias Mr. Aadhi and Mr. Karthikeya Sivasenapathy, Managing Trustee, SKCRF called for a Protest Rally demanding the Jallikattu ban to be revoked. The rally was organised in Alanganallur on January 16, 2017. Over 1 lakh people came together to show their support for the cause.

Alagumalai Protest on January 17, 2017

A protest meeting was organised in Alagumalai on January 17, 2017. Twenty-five thousand people participated to demand ban on Jallikattu be removed.

Resigning as Board Member of TNAU

Managing Trustee, a Board Member of TNAU, resigned as Board Member in protest against the ban on Jallikattu.





Chennai Marina Beach Talk on January 19, 2017

Parallel to Alanganallur Protest that happened in January 16, 2017, people started gathering in Chennai Marina in support of Jallikattu.

On January 19, 2017, Managing Trustee spoke to the large crowd in Marina, which gathered to protest against the ban on Jallikattu. His talk was very well received by the young crowd which gathered to peacefully protest against the banning of Jallikattu and to amend the Law on Jallikattu.

Three demands were set by the Managing Trustee in Marina on January 19, 2017. Amend PCA, or a Presidential Ordinance. If either of the demand was not accepted, the next demand was Tamil Nadu MP's resign. The other demand was detailed investigation against the Animal Welfare Organisation like PETA and PFA.

"Amend PCA" and "Tamilnadu MP's Resign", became the slogan to the protestors in Marina and also a trending hash tag universally.

After the talk, the Managing Trustee and Trustees Mr. Himakiran Anugula and Mr. Sundar Ganesan left for Delhi on the invitation from the Government of

Delhi- January 20, 2017- This was a day loaded with lots of activities on Jallikattu.

9 AM- Meet with Mr. Pon Radhakrishnan, Union Minister of State.

10 AM- Meet with Mr. Anil Madhav Dave, Minister for Environment and Forests and discussed the situation in Tamil Nadu.

12 AM- Managing Trustee and Trustee Mr. Sundar Ganesan and Mr. Himakiran Anugula met Mr. Negi, IFS, Chairman of Animal Welfare Board of India.

1 PM- Managing Trustee, Mr. P. Rajasekhar, President, Jallikattu Peravai, Mr. Pon Radhakrishnan, Union Minister and Mrs. Tamilisai Soundara Rajan, State President, BJP, Tamil Nadu, met Mr. Rajnath

Singh, Minister for Home Affairs to brief him about the requirements of the Tamil people and the need to revoke the ban on Jallikattu.

3.30 PM- Delhi Janthar Mantar Talk. Managing Trustee addressed the protestors and supporters from Tamilnadu at Janthar Mantar. Like the Marina talk, this talk was also loaded with content and was very well received by the gathering there.

The video of the Janthar Mantar talk, uploaded in YouTube was closely watched by Tamilians supporting Jallikattu world over. Those against Jallikattu, who opposed the sport on the basis of cruelty, understood the importance of Jallikattu and started supporting the sport after watching the videos on Marina and Janthar Mantar talk.

Delhi Press Meet on January 21, 2017

Managing Trustee and Trustees Mr. Sundar Ganesan and Mr. Himakiran Anugula addressed the National Media. Managing Trustee gave a clear perspective to the Nation explaining the importance of Bio Cultural Sports and why the Jallikattu ban needs to be revoked. He also went in detail to make clear the role of the dubious Animal Welfare Organisations and why they want to ban the sport. He explained how the ban on Jallikattu was a direct threat to the National livestock diversity, and the National Bureau of Animal Genetic Resources, should have been consulted before the ban. He charged the so called animal welfare activist as being funded by the foreign semen industry and corporate livestock group.

Rajasekhar, President, Jallikattu Peravai, Dr.Rajesh, Tamil Nadu Veera Vilayatu Kalagam, Tiruchy., Mr. Ambalatharasar, Tamil Nadu Jallikattu Kalagam, Mr. Karthikeya Sivasenapathy, Managing Trustee, SKCRF and Mr. Aadhi Alias Hip Hop Thamizha, thanked the supports for their staunch support that was the cause for the ordinance to be passed, and requested the remaining protesters to disperse peacefully and meet again if necessary.

Jallikattu Law passed in Tamil Nadu Assembly on January 23, 2017

Trustees of SKCRF were invited to witness the historical event of the Jallikattu Bill being passed in the assembly by amending the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act. Jallikattu Bill was passed unanimously by Members of Ruling, Opposite and other Parties in Tamil Nadu Assembly. The Bill was sent to the President for his assent.

The Honourable Chief Minister Mr. O. Paneerselvam and his cabinet colleagues invited Mr. Karthikeya Sivasenapathy, Managing Trustee, SKCRF, Mr. P. Rajasekhar, President, Jallikattu Peravai, Dr.Rajesh, Tamil Nadu Veera Vilayatu Kalagam, Tiruchy, Mr. Ambalatharasar, Tamil Nadu Jallikattu Kalagam, Mr. Aadhi Alias Hip Hop Thamizha and SKCRF Trustees, Mr. Sundar Ganesan and Mr. Himakiran Anugula to the Secretariat. The Chief Minister thanked the Trustees for taking up an important cause for the State and appreciated the role of SKCRF.


